

Firewall settings in LUCY < 3.2

LUCY comes with a set of firewall rules build into linux (iptables) to restrict access from the network. The firewall config is restored on each reboot. The rules are stored in `"/opt/phishing/config/iptables.conf"`. The script that reads iptables rules is located in `"/etc/network/if-up.d/iptables"`.

Using [root access](#) you can either edit the rules in the file, or change/remove the script that reads them on each reboot. To remove the currently applied iptables rules and clear the firewall table you need to run a command `"iptables -F"`.

Firewall settings in LUCY > 3.2

In LUCY > 3.2 you [can set custom access control lists](#) within the GUI.
